# SOCIO-ECONOMIC PROFILING OF PM SVANIDHI BENEFICIARIES AND THEIR FAMILIES



## 1. BACKGROUND

COVID-19 pandemic has adversely impacted the livelihoods of street vendors. Keeping this in view, the PM Street Vendor's AtmaNirbhar Nidhi (PM SVANidhi) - a Central Sector Scheme was launched by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, on June 1, 2020 to facilitate special micro-credit for working capital to street vendors, through Lending Institutions, for facilitating resumption of their livelihoods.

As envisioned by the Hon'ble Prime Minister, PM SVANidhi scheme should not to be seen from the perspective of extending only loans to street vendors, but should also be seen as an instrument for outreach to street vendors and their families' for their holistic development and socio-economic upliftment.

Therefore, it is felt appropriate to link PM SVANidhi beneficiaries and their families, as per their respective eligibilities, to the existing welfare schemes of the Government of India, designed as safety nets to protect the poor from the socio-economic risks and insecurities of life and livelihoods. This exercise is being undertaken under the overall ambit of PM SVANidhi Scheme.

## 2. OBJECTIVE

The programme would map the socio-economic profile of the PM SVANidhi beneficiaries and their families, assess their potential eligibility for various Central welfare schemes and facilitate the linkages to these schemes.

The socio-economic profiling will also help States, if they deem fit, to extend their State-specific welfare schemes & benefits, to the eligible PM SVANidhi beneficiaries and their families.

## 3. COVERAGE

The programme will cover PM SVANidhi beneficiaries and their household members in 125 cities, in the first phase, up to the duration of PM SVANidhi scheme i.e. March 2022. (List of 125 ULBs is at Annexure A)

## 4. AREAS OF SOCIO-ECONOMIC PROFILING

Socio Economic profiling of the PM SVANidhi beneficiaries and their families will focus on collecting information/ data in respect of:

- Housing and other assets,
- Health coverage and disability status,
- Education, Skills and Employment,
- Women and Child Welfare,

- e. Banking and Insurance,
- f. Migration status,
- g. Occupational Category of family members,
- h. Aspirational Mapping, and
- i. Any other relevant area.

The key purposes of the socio-economic profiling are -

- a. Access mapping w.r.t eligibility for Central Schemes (List of selected Schemes for the program is in Annexure B), and
- b. Creation of baseline data for PM SVANidhi beneficiaries.

## 5. DATA COLLECTION

A structured respondent-based survey shall be administered through an IT platform, where no documents will be collected at the survey stage. The IT platform will have an embedded feature to assess the potential eligibility of the respondents for selected Central Welfare Schemes.

MoHUA has engaged a third-party agency for developing the questionnaire and an IT tool for collection of data. Data collection will be done by the Urban Local Bodies (ULBs). The IT tool will also include a 'dashboard' for information, monitoring, etc.

The list of beneficiaries, for the selected cities, will be provided through the PM SVANidhi Portal.

MoHUA will arrange for web-based training and sensitization of ULB officials for conducting the socio-economic profiling.

The administrative expenditure for program implementation would be borne by MoHUA and would be transferred directly to ULBs.

## 6. FACILITATING LINKAGES TO CENTRAL WELFARE SCHEMES

Data thus collected, at the ULB level, of potential eligibility of the respondents will be shared with the concerned ministries/ departments to assess city-wise the targets and devise strategies. This data will also be shared with concerned State Governments/ District Administration to ensure speedy linkages of PM SVANidhi beneficiaries and their families with the selected Central Schemes.

The profiled data may also be utilised to extend State-specific welfare schemes & benefits to beneficiaries and their families, as decided by the States

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## 8. BRANDING & IEC

Branding is an important aspect of communicating about the programme with different stakeholders, especially the target beneficiaries. Innovative use of various platforms including the local and social media will be encouraged to reach the targeted beneficiaries in an effective and engaging manner.

Necessary Information, Education and Communication (IEC) and capacity building modules will be provided by MoHUA. This programme will follow the Standard Branding and Communications guidelines issued for the PM SVANidhi Scheme.

## 9. IMPLEMENTATION PARTNER

A Third party implementation partner will be engaged by MoHUA for -

1. Designing the respondent-based survey questionnaire
2. Development of IT tool for data collection and data-dashboard
3. Capacity building of ULB officials for IT tool handling (till three months)
4. Real time back end support and regular data analysis
5. Baseline Data analysis and submissions

## 10. ADMINISTRATIVE AND MONITORING MECHANISM

The programme will have the following implementation structure at the Central, State/UT, District and ULB level.

Roles and responsibilities at each level are provided below:

A Central Level Steering Committee chaired by Secretary, HUA (Composition of the committee is at Annexure C) would oversee and monitor the implementation of the programme.

There will be an Executive Committee chaired by Joint Secretary, DAY- NULM that will be represented by the nominated JS level officers of the concerned Central Ministries, to supervise the day-to-day implementation of the programme.

All the Central ministries/ departments shall also nominate a Director level officer as 'National Nodal Officer (NNO)' for any information exchange regarding programme implementation.

Additionally, all the above mentioned ministries/ departments will nominate State Level Nodal Officers (SLNOs), Regional Nodal Officers (RNOs) and City Level Nodal Officers (CLNOs), who will directly monitor and implement the coverage in the selected 125 cities. The RNOs/CLNOs will coordinate with concerned District Collectors/ Municipal Commissioners to ensure sourcing of applications and scheme linkages. The ULBs will mobilize beneficiaries for sourcing of applications and coordinate with CLNOs.



The Central Nodal Officers (CNOs), appointed to supervise the implementation of the PM SVANidhi Scheme in these selected 125 cities, would also be supervising implementation of this programme.

A State level/ UT level Monitoring Committee, chaired by the Principal Secretary/ Secretary of Urban Development/ Municipal Administration (composition of the committee is at Annexure D), will monitor all aspects of the programme implementation in the Districts and ULBs within the State/ UT.

A District Level Committee will be chaired by of District Collector (composition of the committee is at Annexure E). In bigger Municipal Corporations, where the Municipal Commissioner is senior to Collector he/she will head such a Committee. This Committee will have representatives of relevant State Government Departments such as Civil Supplies, Health, Women and Child etc.,

and RNO/CLNO.

Urban Local Bodies will be responsible for web- based/ mobile application-based data collection of the PM SVANidhi beneficiaries and their families. For the purpose of data collection, ULBs may deploy locally suitable mechanism such as door-to-door data collection or mobilising beneficiaries at the ULB office or camp mode, subject to strict adherence to the COVID-19 restrictions. ULB should also undertake outreach and awareness activities for the programme.

The ULB will share the data on eligible beneficiaries, derived from IT- based data collection, with the District level committee, for further processing the scheme benefits to the eligible beneficiaries.
